 - 2/13/18 through 2/26/18 Recommended timeframe for local ordinances, resolutions, tax rate statement of bond measure or orders for calling an election to be filed with the Registrar of Voters office.
 - 2/13/18 through 3/9/18 During this period candidates must file Declaration of Candidacy and nomination papers
- Tuesday November 6, 2018
 - 7/16/18 through 7/30/18 Recommended timeframe for local ordinances, resolutions, tax rate statement of bond measure or orders for calling an election to be filed with the Registrar of Voters office.

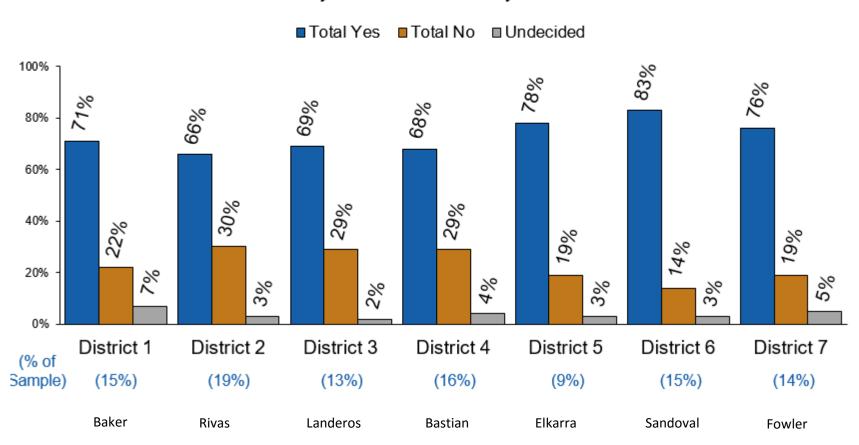

Polling Results by Trustee Area 6/28/16 G.O. Bond November 2016

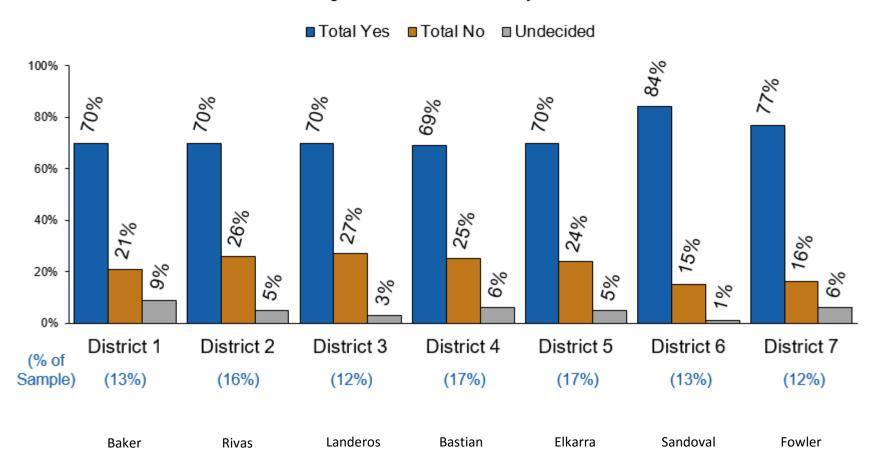
Elementary School Initial Vote by Trustee District

Middle & High School Initial Vote by Trustee District



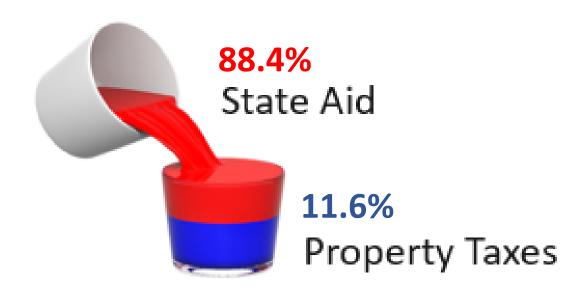

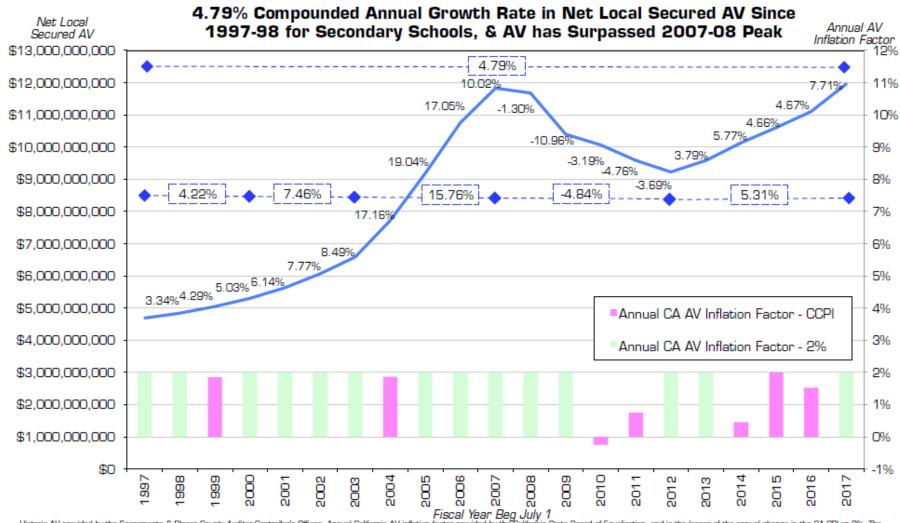

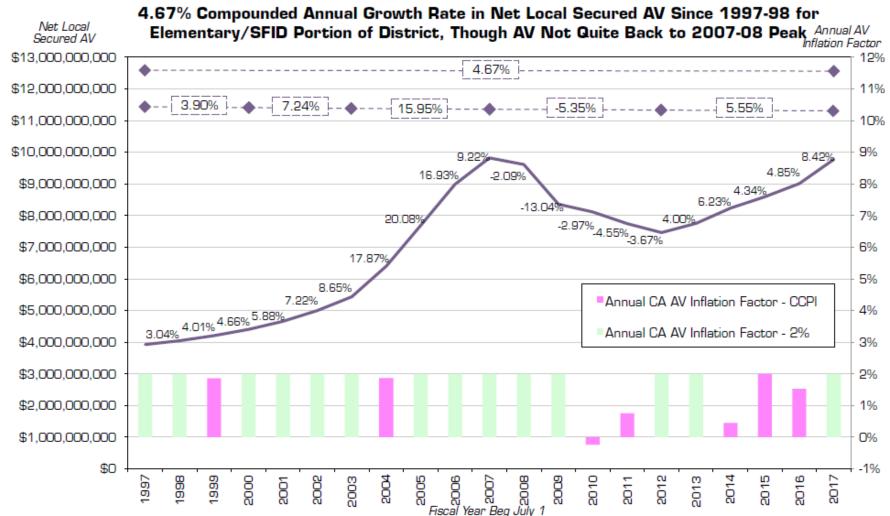

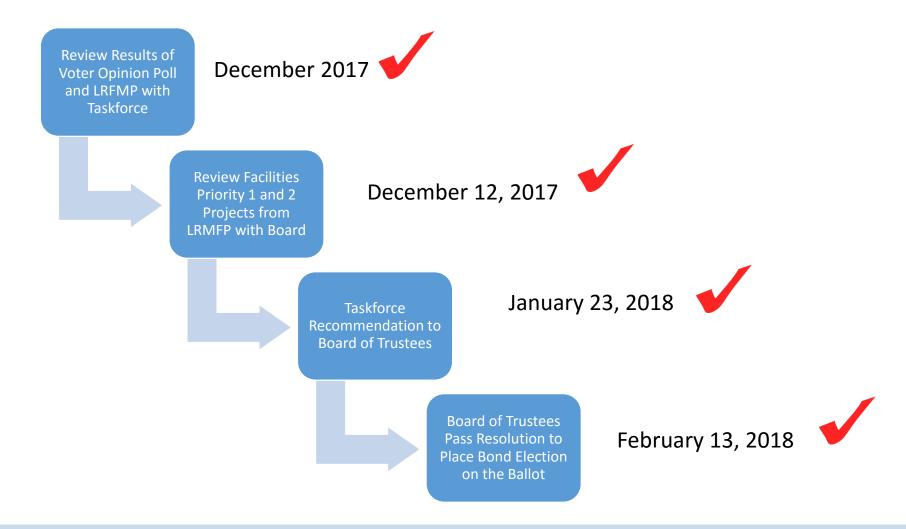
