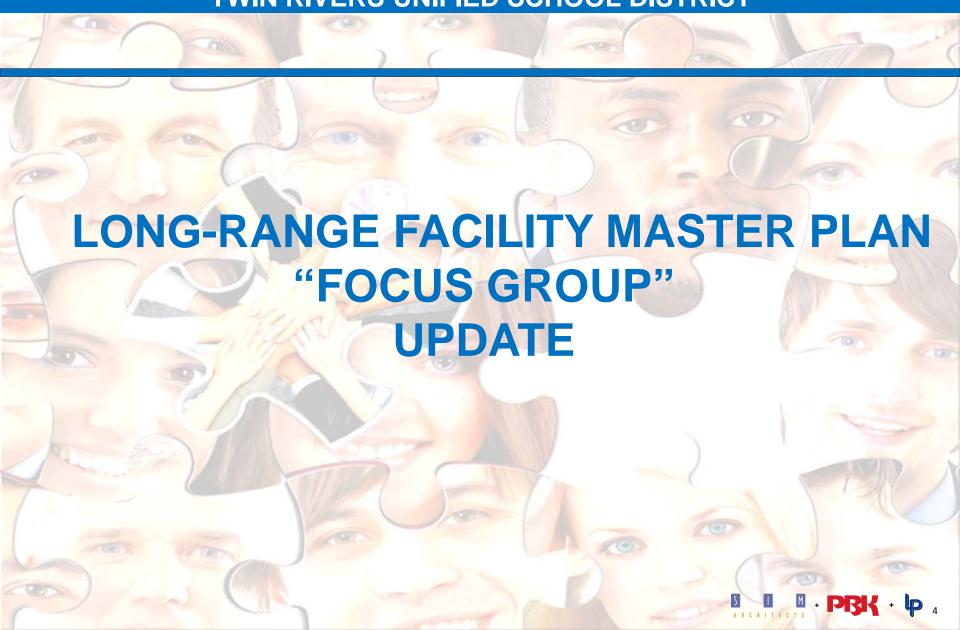

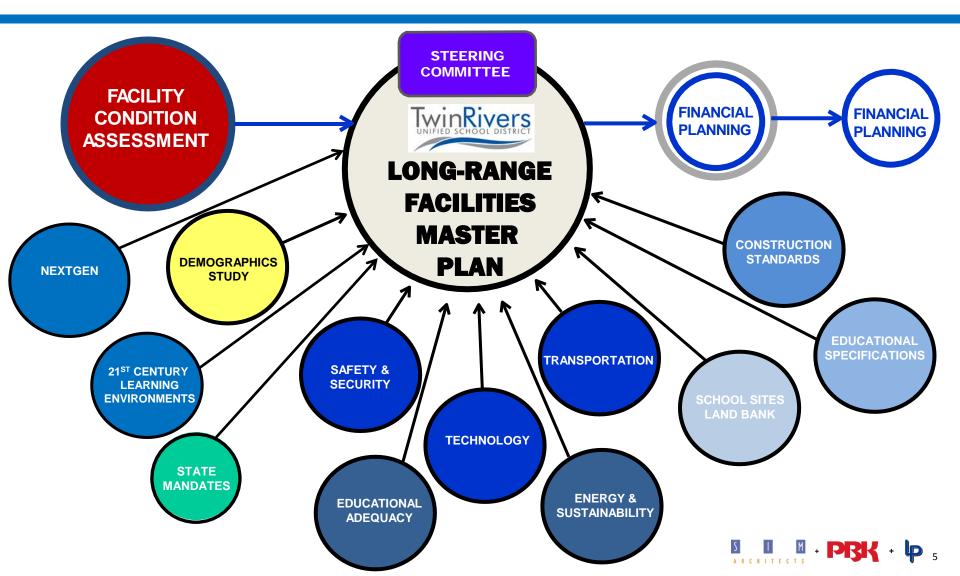

- ➤ Learning environments to support Educational Adequacy for curriculum to be taught (electrical/data infrastructure, furniture, etc.)
- Provides spatial requirements and relationships
- Promotes District's vision and core beliefs

- Modify door hardware at exterior openings and provide card readers at select locations with phased approach
- Replace aged exterior windows with new exterior store front system

#### **UPGRADE SECURITY INFRASTRUCTURE**

- Standardized paging system, clocks and bells
- Provide back-up server in case of system failure

- Increase size of locker rooms to accommodate P.E. and Athletics

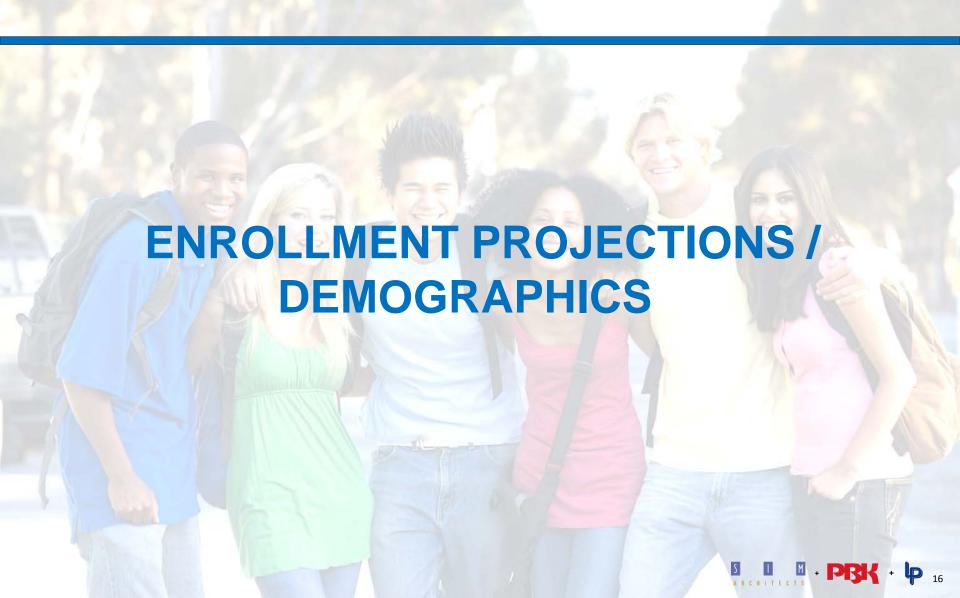
