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SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

Regency Park Pride extends far beyond the regular school day. The community here prides itself on developing our students' whole self. One way we achieve this is through our commitment to health. Students have the opportunity to experience a new fruit or vegetable each month with our Food of the Month program. These healthy treats are also available for students three days a week at our salad bar. Healthy lifestyles are encouraged through our partnership with the North Natomas Transportation Management Association (NNTMA). With the NNTMA, Regency Park participates in Walktober, Two Feet Tuesdays, and May Is Bike Month, where we have logged the most miles of any school in the Sacramento area seven times in the past ten years.

Regency Park is involved in a pilot project that promotes inclusion of our students with disabilities within a general education setting that is focused on meeting their academic, social and emotional needs. Each month, Regency Park focuses on a character trait that good citizens exemplify. Our student leadership team also focuses on good citizenship, organizing many opportunities to donate food and clothing to those less fortunate. Here at Regency we fully embrace Project Based Learning, a teaching method in which students gain knowledge and skills by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to an authentic, engaging and complex question, problem or challenge. As a culminating activity, each grade level provides an evening presentation for their families. Last, but not least, the staff at Regency Park understands the need for fun! The Regency Park community participates in Spirit Days, Afternoon Sing, and many fun events put on by our Parent Teacher Association (PTA), including an annual talent show and craft nights.

Regency Park Elementary aims to develop young adults that are college and career ready. Our academic programs are designed to accommodate all learners through both technology and group interventions including Imagine Learning, ST Math, and Accelerated Reader programs.

EXCELLENCE IN EDUCATION

Academically, our school is the top performing school in the district. Regency Park Elementary boasts the highest CAASPP scores in Twin Rivers during the most recent SBAC testing, at 41% proficient or above in Language Arts and 45% proficient or above in math. A huge piece of this achievement is due to implementing Project Based Learning in all grade levels. Students have the opportunity to show what they have learned about the world around them through song, dance, research, drama and other hands-on activities.

NOTABLE ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Regency Park Elementary earned a 2016 Gold Ribbon School Award from the California Department of Education. The Gold Ribbon Awards recognize California schools that have made gains in implementing the academic content and performance standards adopted by the State Board of Education. Additionally, Regency Park was recognized as a 2016 Title 1 Achieving School. Our 5th graders participate in the annual TRUSD speech contest and have won first place in the past.

ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS

Regency Park offers a variety of enrichment opportunities outside of the regular school day. For our Gifted and Talented Education (GATE) students, we have Zentangle art, digital media and robotics classes. We also offer Early Engineers and Firefly Art classes to our students. For student athletes, Regency Park features Let's Get Moving, a program that offers students opportunities to compete in a different sports such as soccer, basketball, baseball, kickball and dodgeball.

All K - 2nd grade students participate in the TRUSD visual arts program. The 3rd - 5th grade students participate in the TRUSD music program. Our 4th graders also participate in Link-Up, where they learn to play the recorder and then have an assembly with members of the Sacramento Philharmonic Symphony. All 5th graders will participate in a visual arts program with the Artists in Residency Program, where they will create Spoken Word, photographs and drawn art.
